COMMANDER'S CORNER

July is the month when the Post must reestablish the committees that do the work during the year. For the past 5 years, as long as I have been here, the same 15 or so people have run these committees, and the Post. Now some of them have asked to take a much-needed break and we need someone to step up and become involved. These committees that I am talking about are relatively short duration and don't involve coming to a lot of meetings. We have people who have done them and would be willing to help, but they have to have someone to help.

Specifically I am talking about the Oratorical Contest, the Boy's State Selection Committee, and the Entertainment Book Committee.

The Entertainment Book Committee is practically a one-person operation. It requires working on your own time, perhaps coming to a couple of membership meetings to distribute and collect the books. We need to get this started quickly because they begin in November. Last year we made over \$1300 selling these books, and we need to do it this year also. Just have the books sent to you, distribute them to members for sale, and collect the money, pay the bill and turn the proceeds into the Treasurer.

The Oratorical Committee is next beginning with coordination in the fall with the schools, when Department publishes its guidance

and disseminates the contest material. This year we sent them a "heads up" in May so the students could begin working on their The school level of competition speech. must be completed by 12/31. The primary focus of the chairman should be to personally communicate with the debate coach, or other responsible individual at each school to generate the interest. This will require someone who can contact the schools speech/debate various high teachers in our region early in the school year and coach them to have a student write a speech on the Constitution. This has been done every year for the past few years, so we have someone who can give you names and help in other ways. The Post does not conduct a contest, but lets each school choose one person to compete at the District level. You have to give the names to the District Oratorical Contest Chair (me), and get the students to the contest.

Next we need someone to select Boys State participants from our local High Schools. Coordination begins in January, when Department distributes the literature and the goal is to complete the selection of delegates by the end of February. In this case, the schools provide us with the applications of interested students and we interview them to select one from each of the major high schools and one from the private high schools and one as a best alternate from the above. All total that adds up to the 5 boys we send to Boys State. This involves keeping in contact with the

counselors at the respective high schools, interviewing the applicants, and selecting the winners. Again, we have been doing this and we have people who can help.

If we don't get people to fill these jobs, we will be unable to fulfill our plans for this year with money and contestants. Please help.

Coming up in August, we will have the Boys State representatives from this year at the meeting to tell us about their experiences at Boys State. If you were interested in helping, this would be a good time to see the finished product and ask questions.
