Interesting Facts about our Nations Veterans:

- Veterans are better educated overall. In particular, 89% of Veterans age 25 or older have a high school diploma, compared to 31.6% of the general population.
- In addition, 25% of Veterans 25 and older have at least a bachelor's degree, compared to 18.9% of the general population.
- Veterans earn more than their peers. The median income for Veterans is 5% higher than the median income for the general population.
- Veterans are less likely to suffer poverty. Overall, 5.6% of Veterans live in poverty, compared with 10.9% of the U.S. adult population in general.

- The most common service-connected disability for Veterans is in the muscoskeletal system (affecting about 40% of all Veterans who have service-connected disabilities.) This is followed by hearing problems (about 11%) and skin problems (about 10%).
- Veterans are half as likely as non-veterans to be in prison – 630 prisoners per 100,000 Veterans compared to 1,390 prisoners per 100, 00 non-veteran U.S. residents.
