# MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Commander **Everett Ison** open the meeting and determined that we had a quorum. Finance Officer **Dave Lips** reported that the General Fund has \$14,813, and the Allocated Fund has \$20,142.

First Vice Cdr. **Kimberly Biggerstaff** reported that we have 356 paid members. Our goal is 486. We are way behind as you can see.

Second Vice r. **Brad Trefz** asked members to collect items for the Rummage Sale in April. He also announced the location of the Social Time on the Monday following the meeting.

A motion was made to send two additional boys to Boy's State this year using the \$458.22 saved by changing to the new phone service and \$91.78 not spent from the charity budget. Motion passed.

A motion to donate \$100 to the Wounded Warrior Program was also approved.

Pickens Jones reported that the Post sold all 50 coupon books from a profit of \$1022.50.

The Post sold about \$700 in chances for the Birdies for Charities while the Auxiliary sold about \$500 in chances. All this money will be returned to the Post around August. We are just barely keeping alive in this fund raiser because we are not selling \$1000 worth of chances. This is due to lack of participation of the members.

Recommendations for Legionnaire of the Year are being received and will be tabulated at the next Ex. Committee meeting on April 12<sup>th</sup>.

Voting for Post Officers will be at the May 20<sup>th</sup> meeting. Nominations for positions can be made until that time thru the members of the Ex. Committee. As a matter of fact, there are not enough people running for office to fill the vacant positions, due to lack of participation.

## RECIPES, RECIPES, RECIPES!

Been thinking about recipes, and why not, since I chair the Cookbook Committee. If your kitchen is anything like mine, its shelves support at least a hundred cookbooks (unless you are firsttime newlyweds). Those books range from the pristine, little-used, like Escoffier's, to the well-worned and stained, like Campbell's, with the "Joy of Cooking" and "Better Homes" cookbook in between. Then there are those little metal boxes of file cards with pieces of can labels stuck in among the hand printed and typed cards. And, lastly, there are those envelopes of loose magazine clippings from "Southern Living" and "Good Housekeeping" you intend to try and maybe copy over.

So, our kitchens are well equipped with such references, numbering in the thousands. But, think of how few you con-

sult, unless you do a lot of entertaining. We really depend on a tiny percentage of our recipe resources, and, for most meals, we just use our experience, our common sense and whatever is in fridge, freezer and pantry. Even those recipes we locate and use commonly will likely have your annotations which you found improves them and tailors them to your taste. "Reduce the salt: omit the MSG; add a couple of shakes of basil." Few of us invent a recipe from scratch. You might try variations on "Grandma Scroggins' Family Supper Casserole", but you aren't inventing, like Martha Stewart or Emeril Lagasse.

None of these observations has much to do with the Committee's mandate, but they should serve to remind you, again, that we need your help --- your donation of a handful of those recipes you are proud of, which means you have tested them. They can be simple and common or they can be more fancy and complex. Please share them with your Post and Auxiliary Unit.
