Pete Koch MEETING HIGHLIGHTS April 18, 2013

The Post Membership Meeting was convened at 7:00 PM in the prescribed manner and a quorum was determined. Minutes of last month's meeting were distributed. read and approved by motion and Finance Officer vote. Kim Biggerstaff had handed out her monthly report and a budget update. The General Fund totaled \$15,915.99 at the beginning of April and the Allocated and Money Market funds held \$22,879.06, for a total bankroll of \$38,795.05. One obsolete entry under "Accrued Expenses" was questioned and resolved.

First Vice Commander Emery Heuermann gave his membership dues status report. There are now 311 paid-up members; 93.4% of our goal of 333. Second Vice Commander Mickey Fussell, reminded us that the Rummage Sale was on the next two days. He also noted that the next trip to Coushatta Casino Resort will take place on May 7th. Make reservations a week ahead to insure a seat on the First Class Tours bus.

Sergeant-at-Arms, Jim Bolin, reported that the winning number for the Birdies-for-Charity was 1615 and only five people had that number to compete by draw for the grand prize. None of the winners were from the Post. Jim went on to comment that the Color Guard was getting more requests for an appearance and that it needs additional members to cover such events. Service Officer Dayton Denton announced that free legal assistance is available to Legion members by a schedule which he If interested, check with has. Dayton for exact time and place to meet with one of the attorneys. Then, Dayton reported that we have enough financial support to send 12 boys to Boys State, and he thanked those in attendance who supported the sponsorship of eight more boys than our budget had afforded. Then he introduced Post member Steve McKinsey, who is starting a program of taking donated small items to the VA Hospital (See more about this under Veterans Advocate on page 3.) The Commander asked District Commander Everett Ison for a report, but he had none

Under **New Business**, the Commander reminded us that the Traveling Trophy will be awarded at this District 7 Convention based on the pounds of coffee and coffee-related goods turned in by each Post. He also reminded us of several future functions during the busy month of May, including

JROTC awards and Memorial Day related events. These are defined under The Bulletin Board and coming events.

Chairman of the Nominating Committee **Emery Heuermann** then enlisted those present as a "committee-of-the-whole" to name the nominees for officership for the coming year. The resulting slate is under the masthead and the election, by those present, is at the May meeting. Be there and VOTE!

There being no further business to come before the membership, the meeting was closed in due order at 8:00 PM.

The Auxiliary then joined the Post to listen to Becky Feaster of the Daughters of the American Revolution speak about a program of living history interviews with veterans which will be video-taped and preserved in the Library of Congress for future generations.

LEGION DUES RENEWAL THROUGH THE NEW ONLINE SYSTEM

You can save time, effort and postage if you take advantage of new Automatic Annual Renewal Program to pay your dues. Post members can simply go to www.legion.org/renew and click on "Renew Now" to safely and conveniently pay their Post dues. Once you enter the information requested, you will set up an account for automatic annual renewal. Alternatively, you can do the same by 'phoning the toll-free American Legion customer service line at 1-(800)433-3318. Having an account showing you are participating in the Program, the Legion will automatically process your renewal at the start of each new membership year, charging your dues to the credit or debit card you have selected. Such transaction will occur around July 15 of each year, and you will receive a confirmation by e-mail. Your email address is part of the information given at set-up.

It will be necessary for you to maintain the info you provide. To do so, 'phone again 1-(800) 433-3318, or send an e-mail to cs@legion.org, or go online to www.legion.org/membershipmanage ment and use the "Change Address" option. Should the Post's dues rate change, the rate in effect at the time of renewal will be charged. You can cancel

participation in the Program at any time, but such order must be received by June 30 to be effective in that renewal cycle. Just submit your request by e-mail to cs@legion.org or in writing to:

Cancellation requests must include: member ID number, name, address, last four digits of the credit/debit card number used and a daytime 'phone number by which a rep can reach you, if needed. If you still have the transaction number that shows on the original confirmation, include that too.

NEW POST DRIVE TO AID HOSPITALIZED VETS

Post 305 is initiating a drive, under the direction of the Service Committee, whereby all Post and Auxiliary members are requested to make donations of small, personal-care items which will be delivered to the Michael E. DeBakev Medical Center (Houston VA Hospital) for the benefit of the wounded, injured and sick veterans there. Examples of such items are toothpaste and brushes. shampoo, deodorant. disposable razor packs, shave cream, lotion, combs and brushes, hard-cover and paperback books, recent magazines, DVD's, playing cards, ball caps, socks, lap robes, new/gently used clothing, handheld games and batteries, phone cards and gift cards. Committee Chairman Denton has put Steve McKinsey in charge of this program. Steve is an Army veteran who has personally experienced VA hospital stays. He will make periodic deliveries to the hospital as donations accumulate. So, bring those new dentist freebies, those un-opened hotel/motel giveaways, those airline playing cards, etc. to any membership meeting

or get them to Dayton or Steve otherwise. If you prefer, a money donation is fine, and Steve will buy the things most needed.

DOD CANCELS ITS PROPOSED "DISTINGUISHED WARFARE MEDAL"

Perhaps many of you might wonder what "distinguished warfare" really is, but, rest easy, it will not be celebrated by a medal, which was to be ranked higher than the Purple Heart and the Star. Bronze The proposed military decoration was to honor drone "pilots" and "cyberwarriors" both important but rear echelon GI's, generally well removed from enemy fire. American Legion Commander Jim Koutz protested the ranking and said it was wholly inappropriate to place such medal above those awarded for valor and courage under fire. Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel halted production of the medal on April 5th and ordered Joint Chiefs Chairman General Dempsey to review the ranking. Some other device will substituted for the DWM to recognize the achievements of the small number of servicemen and women who have an especially direct and immediate impact on

combat operations while serving outside the theatre and off any battlefield.

THE VA SOCIAL WORKER

A question many Veterans should ask themselves is do you need to contact a VA Social Worker? You will find social workers in all program areas in VA medical centers who are ready to help you with almost any need. If you have questions or problems, the social worker will be able to help you or can refer you to the right person for help. Here are just some of the ways that VA social workers can help: (a) They can advise you on getting help from the VA or from community agencies, such as Meals-on-Wheels, so you can continue to live in your own home. (b) They can help in applying for benefits from the VA, Social Security and other government and community programs. Ask your VA social worker. (c) VA social workers develop and implement treatment approaches which address individual social problems and work with acute or chronic medical conditions, dving patients and bereaved families. (d) They are a voice for veterans and their families who are at risk of losing their homes. (e) They

can make sure your doctor and other VA staff on your treatment team know your decisions about end-of-life issues, generally called advance directives and living wills. This includes things like whether you want to be on life support systems or are an organ donor, and which family member or other person you have chosen to make decisions on your behalf when you are unable to make those decisions yourself. (f) They can help you arrange for respite care for your caregiver so she or he can have a break or go on vacation without worrying about who will be caring for you.
