Two significant patriotic and military events were observed in May: Armed Forces Day on the 18th and Memorial Day on the 27th. The Post and Unit participated in the Memorial Day Ceremony at the Houston National Cemetery with the Color Guard trooping the colors and the Auxiliary presenting a wreath. The Post also made Memorial Day presentations at two assistedliving homes and hospices in The Woodlands and Kingwood areas, to recognize the veterans who reside at them.

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

May 16, 2013

The Post Membership Meeting was convened at 7:00 PM in the prescribed manner and a quorum was determined. Minutes of last month's meeting were distributed, read and approved by motion and Finance Officer Kim Biggerstaff had handed out her monthly report, as well as a budget update. The General Fund totaled \$18,488.67 at the beginning of May, and the Allocated and Money Market funds held \$22,880.02, for a total bankroll of \$41.386.69. The reason for the dramatic increase in funds is that we received funds for seven Boy's State sponsorships and have yet to send the money in to the Department.

First Vice Commander Emery Heuermann gave his membership dues status report. There are now 319 paid-up members; 95.8% of our goal of 333. Second Vice Commander Mickey Fussell, reported that he is not planning further trips to Coushatta due to low participation. Instead he planning a daytrip on Saturday, June 22, to the H.E.A.R.T.S. Veterans Museum of Texas. followed by lunch. He suggested that we assemble at McCullough Junior High School parking lot at 9:00 AM and carpool.

Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Bolin had no report. Service Officer Dayton Denton opined that since the newly elected officers are practically the same as outgoing corps, we need to motivate the other 300 members to step up and help run this Post. Dayton also discussed method of getting claims filed and other things done at the VA. He veterans need to proactive. For example, if you have a health test run in one clinic, you need to personally deliver a copy to the clinic or adjuster maintaining your records or to the office that OK'ed the test. Eventually that clinic would get the test results, but if you bring it to the clinic, you will speed up the process and maybe get an appointment earlier.

The Commander asked outgoing District 7 Commander (and Post Judge Advocate) **Everett Ison** for a report, but he had none


Under **New Business**, the Commander announced that **Kim Biggerstaff** has been chosen by the Executive Committee as the Legionnaire-of-the-Year. Way to go, Kim! Then he recognized the Post chili-cookoff contest winner, Mickey Fussell, by award of an appropriate plaque.



The Commander then discussed his effort to get Ms. Kay Lee, the Montgomery County Veterans Service Officer, to provide an update on Veteran's Benefits. She is most willing, but recommended that all county veterans associations be represented. Ms. Lee also offered to host a catered meal, appropriate to the time-of-day. No date has been set as yet.

The Commander took time to read each line of the Preamble to the America Legion Constitution with an explanation as to what those specific goals of association mean.

Chairman of the Nominating Committee **Emery Heuermann** took the podium to determine if there were any additions to the slate of officers nominated at the April meeting. Hearing none, he moved that the Adjutant be directed to provide one vote for the uncontested nominees and that they be declared to be the elected. The Commander took the vote and the slate shown on the first page of this Bugle was duly elected. The elected officers were asked to stand and be recognized. In attendance was the District 7 Commander-Elect Ed Jarvis.



There being no further business to come before the membership, the meeting was closed in due order at 8:00 PM. The Auxiliary then joined the Post to enjoy some victuals and comradeship.

CASUALITY UPDATE

As of April 15, 2013, a total of 2,194 Americans had died in Operation Enduring Freedom. The total includes 2,191 troops and three DoD civilians. Of these deaths, 1,728 were KIA with the enemy, while 460 died in noncombat incidents. There have been 18,404 troops wounded in action during Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan). STOLEN VALOR ACT BEFORE THE PRESIDENT

Congress last week passed the Stolen Valor Act of 2013, introduced by Representative Joe Heck and Senator Dean Heller. both from Nevada. H.R. 258 was passed overwhelmingly by the House on Monday by a vote of 390-3, and the Senate passed its companion, S. 210, Wednesday night by unanimous consent. The legislation now heads to the White House for the President's signature. Congress followed the roadmap laid out by the U.S. Supreme Court when thev overturned the original Stolen Valor Act last year. In their writings, the high court suggested any future legislation had to be narrower in focus than just to penalize people for simple lying, which they ruled is protected speech in a 6-3 decision. Now the new language is bullet-proof, because the focus is on the intent to profit from the lie, to obtain money, property or something of a

tangible benefit, which is what con artists have been doing throughout history. Not every combat award is covered, but the ones most worn by wannabe heroes will be protected once the bill becomes law.

HOUSE SUBCOMMITTEE CLEARS GI PERSONNEL BILL

Last week, the House Armed Services Subcommittee on Mliitary Personnel cleared its section of the FY 2014 Defense Authorization Bill (H.R. 1960) by voice vote. Among the provisions is language to combat stricter military sexual assault, which would bar commanders from dismissing all but minor sexual offenses from a court martial, and prohibit them from reducing a "guilty" finding in a sexual assault case to a lesser offense. The language comes on the heels of recent reports from the Pentagon estimating that 70 sexual assaults take place every day in the military. Other provisions included a 1.8 percent pay raise for service members and strong rejections to any Tricare Fee increases. The full committee is expected to take up the bill sometime after the Memorial Day recess.

MEMORIAL DAY

When we were kids and old enough to appreciate a "holiday", we became aware of Decoration Day or, as it was also known after 1882, Memorial Day. We learned that the holiday originated after the Civil War to commemorate the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in that conflict. By the 20th century, Memorial Day had been extended to honor all Americans who have died while in wars involving the United States. The graves of those veterans are decorated with flags, wreaths and flowers.

The first-known observance of a Memorial Day was in Charleston, SC, on May 1, 1865, where Union POW's were held at Charleston Race Course and about 250 POW's died there and were buried in unmarked graves.

In 1967, by Federal law, the holiday officially became "Memorial Day", and, in the following Congress passed vear. "Uniform Monday Holiday Act", which moved four holidays, including Memorial Day, from their traditional dates to a specified Prior to that Act, Monday. Memorial Day was on May 30, a date which had no specific significance

hold Most US communities parades on Memorial Day, which in some cities and towns end at a National or the local cemetery. Most of these feature marching bands and an overall military theme, with the National Guard and other locally-based servicemen participating, along with associations. veterans The Woodlands Post 305 traditionally presents its colors and its Unit lays a wreath at the Houston National Cemetery.


