MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

July 18, 2013

The Post Membership Meeting was convened at 7:00 PM in the prescribed manner and a quorum was determined. Minutes of last month's meeting were distributed, read and approved by motion and Finance Officer Kim vote. Biggerstaff had handed out her monthly financial report and a budget update. The General Fund \$16.451.07 totaled at the beginning of May and the Allocated and Money Market funds held \$22,8876.93, for a total bankroll of \$39.328.00. Kim expressed the thanks of the Post to all who contributed to the May Match Madness drive.

First Vice Commander Emery Heuermann noted that it was the beginning of a new year and no membership numbers were available vet. Second Vice Commander Mickey Fussell reported that he was disappointed that we were unable to fill up the chairs on the Fourth of July Parade float with Legion and Auxiliary members. We lost out to the Marine Corps League among "military" entrants, but will do better next year.



Mickey also reported that the storage facility of rummage sale stock was out of room for big items. Small bags of clothing and small boxes are OK, but save the big stuff until the Rummage Sale in the Spring.

Mickey was persuaded to revive the trips to Louisiana casinos, so he is inviting anyone who is interested to go with him on September 3rd (the first Tuesday in September) to Coushatta Casino Resort. Look in the Bulletin Board to get information how to join the bus trip to Coushatta with **Mickey**. He also reported that he will schedule a trip to the Battleship Texas in December. Keep that in mind and check the Bulletin Board to find the exact date.

Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Bolin and Historian Win Salter had no report. Chaplain Victoria Glover reported that her home suffered a fire and she was quite displaced by it. Service Officer Dayton Denton was absent, but he had noted at the Executive Committee Meeting that Boys State went well, except the program had admitted too many boys and some had to be sent home.

The membership voted to donate \$200 to **Jerry Beaird**, District Commander of The Sons of the American Legion, whose house burned down while he was at the Department Convention. The membership also voted to spend \$230 to join the Chamber of Commerce to support one of the Commander's goals of improving community outreach and public relations.

The meeting was then closed in the customary manner and those present enjoyed the pot-luck supper prepared by the Auxiliary.

THE AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL CONVENTION COMES TO TOWN

From Saturday, August 24, to Thursday, August 29, Houston will be flooded by members of The American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary, plus a few hog-riders who are headed here en masse from Indianapolis. The weekend schedule is filled with various committee meetings and caucuses and a memorial service. The National Convention Parade kicks off on Sunday at 4:00 PM.

The site of these doings is the George R. Brown Convention Center. with the Auxiliary's Juniors meeting at the Hilton Americas Hotel. The Opening Session starts on Monday at 8:00 AM. Other highlights include several person-of-the-year luncheons, the Commander's Banquet on Tuesday and the States Dinner on Wednesday. Besides sit-down meals, the business goes on in general and breakout sessions, Monday through Thursday. The incoming National Officers will be installed Thursday morning and will meet as the new Executive Committee thereafter. Delegates and guests from Post 305 will be selected by the August 15th membership meeting.



APPLYING FOR A SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN ANNUITY PAYOUT

If you are the designated beneficiary of a deceased military retiree's Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP), complete and submit the following documents to begin your SBP annuity payout (NOTE: All forms can be completed online and downloaded at the websites given):

Verification For Survivors Annuity (DD2656-7) at http://www.dtic.mil/whs/directiv es/infomgt/forms/eforms/dd265 6-7.pdf. Section by section instructions are available at http://www.dfas.mil/retiredmilita ry/survivors/Retiree-death/ sbp.html. If you have questions

or need assistance completing this form, contact DFAS at 1-800-321-1080. Form DD2656-7 requires the following accompanying documentation as applicable for processing:

Certificate of Death: Required within 60 days of establishing the Annuity. Submit a legible copy of the original Certificate of Death (including cause and manner of death). DFAS is unable to return original documents.

IRS Form W-4P: Available at <u>http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-</u> <u>pdf/fw4p.pdf</u> to have taxes for U.S. citizens withheld from

annuity payments; or **IRS Form W-8BEN:** Available at <u>http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-</u> pdf/fw8ben.pdf to have taxes for

pdf/fw8ben.pdf to have taxes for non-U.S. citizens withheld from annuity payments.

FMS 2231 Fast Start Direct Deposit Form: Available at http://www.fms.treas.gov/eft/22 31.pdf to have money directly deposited to your bank account rather than a hard copy check being mailed.

Direct Deposit Enrollment Form (SF 1199A): Available at http://fms.treas.gov/eft/SF-

<u>1199A-2012.pdf</u> if annuitant has no SSN assigned; or

International Direct Deposit Enrollment Form (SF 1199-I): Available at <u>http://www.dtic</u> .mil/whs/directives/infomgt/forms/ <u>eforms/of1199i.pdf</u> for an overseas financial institution.

Additional documentation may be needed, depending on the claimant:

Citizenship Affidavit – Include if the claimant does not live in the US and is anyone other than the member's child.

Custodianship - If the claimant is a minor this form must be signed by the parent/guardian.

POA or Guardianship – If someone else signs on behalf of the claimant supporting documenttation is needed.

Child Annuitant's School Certification (DD2788): For minors or incapacitated annuitants only. Available at <u>http://www.dtic</u> mil/whs/directives/infomgt/form s/eforms/dd2788.pdf.

UPDATE ON APPLYING FOR BENEFITS UNDER A SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN

If you have elected to cover your spouse or loved ones under the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP), you should be aware of a recent change to the process for application for benefits. Effective April 1, 2013, all applications for annuities under the SBP plan will require a photocopy submission of the annuitant's Social Security Card. If annuitant has no SSN assigned, include a note in your application package stating so and provide their ITIN number if one has been assigned. If your designated beneficiary does not

submit a Social Security Card photocopy with the application, the annuity will still be established and the annuitant will be allotted 90 days to submit the photocopy to DFAS. If it is not received after 90 days, the account will be suspended further and no payments will be made until their card's photocopy is received. It will apply to all annuities established after April 1, 2013, but will have no effect on annuitants in receipt of SBP payments prior to April 1, 2013. Military retirees make the necessary should preparations for their beneficiaries. Keep your files up to date so both you and your beneficiary can be prepared for unexpected events.
